1 1. Do you support legislation that protects preborn human life from abortion, including prohibiting taxpayer funding, and rejecting abortion as a right in the Delaware State Constitution? (References: SB 317 (2024); HB 110 (2024); SB 301 (2024); SB 232 (2024); HB 31 (2023); HB 400 (2022); SB 251 (2026); SB 252 (2026))

RESPONSE**No**

I oppose broad legislation that removes reproductive healthcare decisions from women and their medical providers or denies coverage based on political ideology. I support bodily autonomy, medically accurate information, informed consent, appropriate professional standards, and accountability for negligence across all healthcare settings. I also support policies that reduce unintended pregnancies and improve maternal and infant outcomes through accessible contraception, prenatal care, childcare support, and economic stability. Government should protect health and personal liberty while ensuring medical providers meet clear

2 2. Do you support legislation that holds the abortion industry accountable and liable for medical malpractice, negligence in providing informed consent, and removing the safeguards meant to protect women? (References: SB 252 (2026); HB 31 (2021); HB 400 (2022), HB 320 (2022); SB 301 (2024))

RESPONSE**Yes**

Every patient deserves safe, ethical, and competent medical care. I support holding all healthcare providers including abortion providers - accountable for medical malpractice, negligence, and failures to obtain informed consent. Patients should receive accurate medical information, understand the risks and alternatives available to them, and have access to appropriate legal remedies when professional standards are violated. At the same time, accountability should be applied fairly and consistently across the healthcare system, without creating politically motivated standards that single out one area of medical practice

3 3. Do you oppose legalized assisted suicide and attempts to expand it? (References: HB 140 (2024))

RESPONSE**Undecided**

End-of-life decisions are among the most personal and difficult choices individuals and families can face. Before supporting or opposing legislation of this magnitude, I believe it is important to carefully examine the medical evidence, ethical considerations, legal safeguards, and the experiences of other states. My priority is protecting vulnerable individuals while respecting personal dignity, ensuring informed consent, and maintaining the integrity of the medical profession. I would evaluate any proposal based on whether it includes strong safeguards, transparency, and protections against coercion or abuse

4 4. Do you support amending the Delaware Constitution to explicitly protect the fundamental right of parents to direct the upbringing, education, and care of their children? (References: HB 319 (2022))

RESPONSE Yes

Parents are a child's first and most important teachers, and they should have a meaningful role in decisions affecting their child's upbringing, education, and well-being. I support protecting parental rights while recognizing the state's responsibility to intervene when a child's safety or welfare is at risk. Schools, families, and communities achieve the best outcomes when they work together through open communication, transparency, and mutual respect. My goal is to strengthen those partnerships while always keeping the best interests of the child at the center of public policy

RESPONSE Yes

Children deserve the highest standard of medical care and protection, especially when decisions may have lifelong consequences. I support evidence-based healthcare, thorough psychological evaluation, meaningful parental involvement, informed consent, and strong professional accountability for medical providers. As medical research continues to evolve, Delaware should ensure that any irreversible intervention involving minors meets the highest standards of safety, ethics, and transparency while treating every child and family with dignity and respect

6 6. Do you support legislation that protects the fundamental rights of children to know and be known by their biological mother and father, prohibits changing a child's sex on their birth certificate, and protects family biological connection between parents and children? (References: SB 250 (2026); HB 375 (2026))

RESPONSE Yes

Every child deserves access to accurate information about their biological and medical history, as that information can be important for identity, healthcare, and family connections. I support maintaining accurate government records while treating every family with dignity and respect. Legal parents, adoptive parents, and guardians all play vital roles in a child's life, but preserving truthful biological information serves the long-term interests of the child. Any policy in this area should balance transparency, privacy, and equal treatment under the law.

7 7. Do you oppose policies that embed sexually explicit material and comprehensive sexuality frameworks into school libraries and public school curricula, particularly when they conflict with obscenity laws, parental rights, or religious beliefs? RESPONSE Yes

Students deserve an education that is age-appropriate, medically accurate, and focused on helping them grow into healthy, responsible adults. Parents should know what is being taught and have meaningful opportunities to review curriculum and participate in their child's education. I support transparency, appropriate educational standards, and keeping materials that are not age-appropriate out of our classrooms while ensuring students receive factual health education that prepares them for life.

8 8. Do you support legislation that preserves sex-based protections in athletics to ensure fairness, safety, and equal opportunity for female athletes? (References: SB 191 (2024); SB 215 (2026))

RESPONSE Yes

Every student deserves dignity, respect, and opportunities to participate in school activities. At the same time, athletic competition should be fair and safe for all participants. I support preserving competitive opportunities for girls and women while encouraging schools and athletic organizations to develop respectful, evidence-based policies that recognize both fairness in competition and the dignity of every student. Public policy should be guided by science, safety, and equal opportunity - not political rhetoric

9 9. Do you support protecting individuals, churches, schools, and faith-based ministries from government penalties when operating according to sincerely held religious beliefs regarding sexuality, marriage, and human life? (References: HB 199 (2021); HB 74 (2023); HB 275 (2024); SB 169 (2021); SB 100 (2025); HB 37 (2025))

RESPONSE Yes

Religious liberty is a fundamental constitutional freedom that should be protected for every Delawarean. Individuals, houses of worship, and faith-based organizations should be free to practice their sincerely held beliefs without unnecessary government interference. At the same time, I believe government has a responsibility to protect the rights and dignity of all people. Good public policy should respect both religious freedom and equal treatment under the law, resolving conflicts in a way that is fair, constitutional, and consistent with our shared commitment to liberty.

10 10. Do you support ensuring Delaware law clearly protects free speech, religious expression, and public advocacy - while limiting criminal penalties only to physical violence, threats, or force? (References: HB 272 (2025); SB 300 (2024))

RESPONSE Yes

Freedom of speech and religious expression are fundamental constitutional rights and essential to a healthy democracy. People should be free to express their views, advocate for change, practice their faith, and criticize their government without fear of punishment simply because others disagree with them. At the same time, the law should continue to hold individuals accountable for true threats, violence, intimidation, harassment that violates the law, and other criminal conduct. Protecting free expression and protecting public safety are both essential responsibilities of government.

I am running for State Representative because I believe public service should be rooted in integrity, accessibility, and action. I am a husband, father, small business owner, Public Allies alum, youth advocate, and community organizer whose experience has been shaped by working directly alongside the people I hope to represent. I have hired from my community, mentored young people, organized around difficult issues, and seen firsthand both the challenges our neighborhoods face and the potential they possess.

I am not running because I believe I have every answer. I am running because I know how to listen, bring people together, ask difficult questions, and turn community concerns into action. My priorities are clear: safer and stronger students, protecting voting rights, making life more affordable, improving neighborhood infrastructure, and restoring trust in government through transparency and real access to representation.

I will approach legislation the same way I approached this questionnaire: understand the facts, listen to different perspectives, remain grounded in my principles, and consider how each decision affects the people I was elected to serve. I am willing to work with anyone who is serious about improving Delaware, while maintaining the independence to respectfully disagree when necessary.

Ultimately, I want constituents to know that I am already invested in this community. I am not waiting for a title to serve it. If elected, the title will simply give me another tool to continue the work.
