1 1. Do you support legislation that protects preborn human life from abortion, including prohibiting taxpayer funding, and rejecting abortion as a right in the Delaware State Constitution? (References: SB 317 (2024); HB 110 (2024); SB 301 (2024); SB 232 (2024); HB 31 (2023); HB 400 (2022); SB 251 (2026); SB 252 (2026))

RESPONSE No

People will always disagree about the point at which a fertilized egg transforms into a full human life with rights equal to that of the mother, and different religions have different positions on that point. The key question for abortion is who decides. Because of moral pluralism and the fact that each woman knows her own situation and whether bearing a child will harm her life, it should be up to her to decide whether or not to bear a child. Abortion is part of reproductive healthcare and should be considered such. That is why I am pro-choice.

2 2. Do you support legislation that holds the abortion industry accountable and liable for medical malpractice, negligence in providing informed consent, and removing the safeguards meant to protect women? (References: SB 252 (2026); HB 31 (2021); HB 400 (2022), HB 320 (2022); SB 301 (2024))

RESPONSE No

Health care providers are already bound by the law, and patients already have the right to sue for malpractice or negligence.

3 3. Do you oppose legalized assisted suicide and attempts to expand it? (References: HB 140 (2024))

RESPONSE Yes

I believe that person has a right to end his/her life, and I support legalized assisted suicide for people who are terminally ill. I was proud to vote for HB 140 and would like to see it expanded, as it is currently extremely restrictive.

4 4. Do you support amending the Delaware Constitution to explicitly protect the fundamental right of parents to direct the upbringing, education, and care of their children? (References: HB 319 (2022))

RESPONSE No

I support parental rights, but I do not think we need a constitutional amendment.

5 5. Do you support holding medical providers legally accountable and liable for performing experimental, permanent, or irreversible medical interventions on minors that interrupt and pause puberty, introduce cross sex hormones, and amputate body parts? (References: HB 346 (2024); SB 55 (2025))

RESPONSE No

It is not up to the government to interfere in people's medical decision-making. Again, it is a question of who decides. In the case of minors, the parents know the child and what is best for him/her, not the government. That is part of parental rights, which you say you support.

6 6. Do you support legislation that protects the fundamental rights of children to know and be known by their biological mother and father, prohibits changing a child's sex on their birth certificate, and protects family biological connection between parents and children? (References: SB 250 (2026); HB 375 (2026))

RESPONSE No

7 7. Do you oppose policies that embed sexually explicit material and comprehensive sexuality frameworks into school libraries and public school curricula, particularly when they conflict with obscenity laws, parental rights, or religious beliefs? (References: HB 199 (2021); SB 97 (2024); HB 119 (2025); SCR 156 (2026))

RESPONSE No

I disagree with the premise of this question. I support comprehensive sex education, and do not consider it obscene or pornographic, as your organization has repeatedly asserted. That said, I do believe parents should be able to opt their children out of lessons that offend their beliefs.

8 8. Do you support legislation that preserves sex-based protections in athletics to ensure fairness, safety, and equal opportunity for female athletes? (References: SB 191 (2024); SB 215 (2026))

RESPONSE No

School sports are part of the learning experience for children and thus should be available to all students. If a student is trans, they should be allowed to play sports on the team that accords with their gender identity. DE does not allow discrimination on the basis of gender identity.

9 9. Do you support protecting individuals, churches, schools, and faith-based ministries from government penalties when operating according to sincerely held religious beliefs regarding sexuality, marriage, and human life? (References: HB 199 (2021); HB 74 (2023); HB 275 (2024); SB 169 (2021); SB 100 (2025); HB 37 (2025))

RESPONSE Undecided

I do believe strongly in religious freedom, but the bills you cite don't interfere with religious freedom. SB 100, for example, *explicitly* protects religious freedom, not requiring religious orgs from recognizing or performing same-sex marriages, yet you insist otherwise. HB 37 prohibits discrimination in public accommodations and does not infringe on religious liberty. I put undecided because I would have to look at each bill and see whether or not it actually interferes with religious freedom.

10 10. Do you support ensuring Delaware law clearly protects free speech, religious expression, and public advocacy - while limiting criminal penalties only to physical violence, threats, or force? (References: HB 272 (2025); SB 300 (2024))

RESPONSE Undecided

Freedom of speech is protected by the state and federal constitutions, and it is something I support. Once again, the bills you cite don't interfere with the rights you say you support. I put undecided because I don't agree with the premise of the question.
